Astrobiology Lecture Course Network: ABC-Net

- a real time tele-teaching combining a consortium of European universities together with the European Space Agency
- Pilot study 2005/2006 with 5 universities
- Follow-on project 2007/2008 with 11 universities
- Lectures were part of the university lecture plan
- Students received European credit points after examination
- Lectures were recorded and available on the web as video-on-demand session

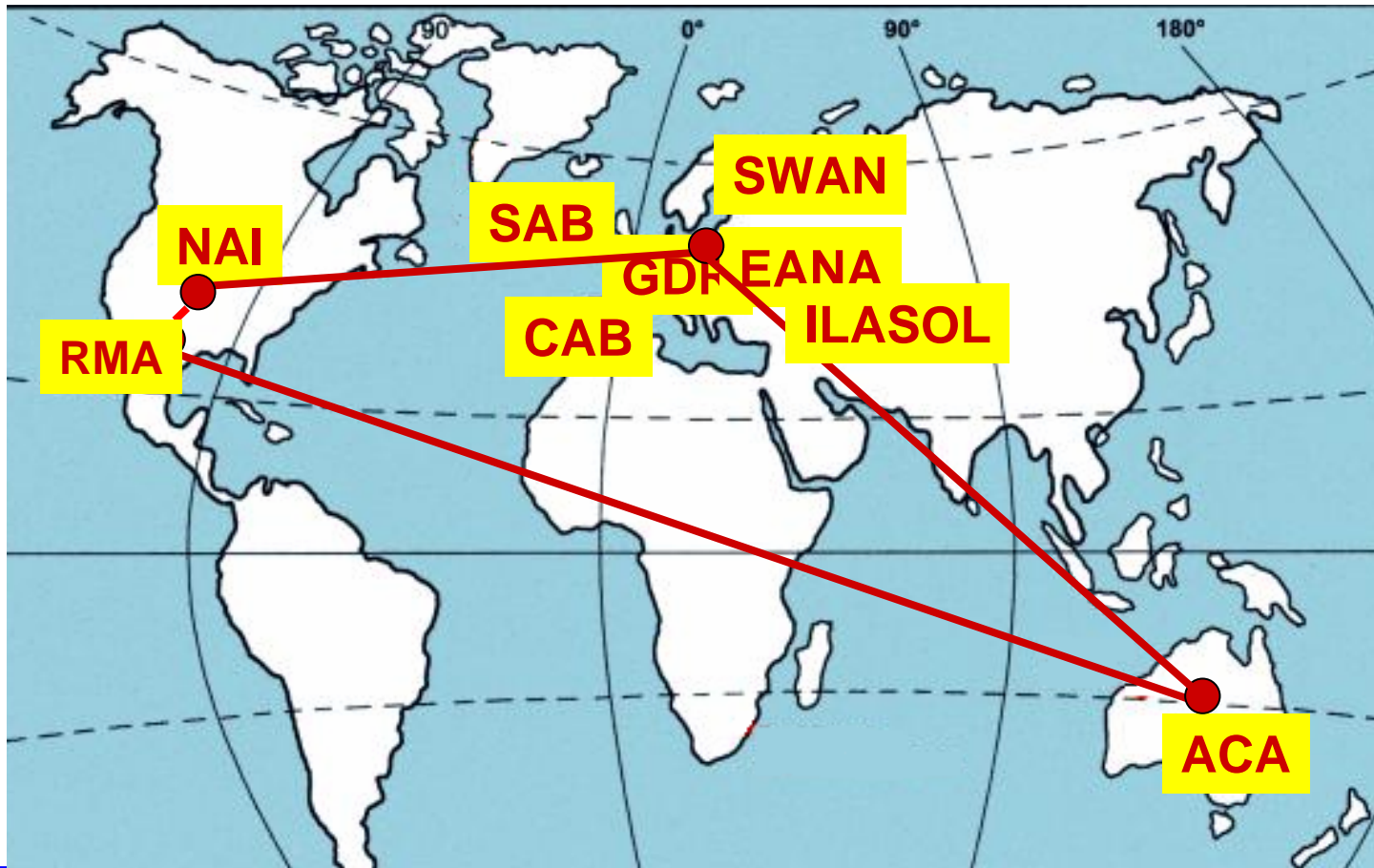
